Dear Dr. Brolley:

This will confirm the finding of the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss Projection Methodology on May 11, 2017, that the CoreLogic, Inc. model has been determined acceptable for projecting hurricane loss costs and probable maximum loss levels for residential rate filings. The determination of acceptability expires on November 1, 2019.

The Commission has determined that the Florida Hurricane Model 2017a limited to the options selected in the input form provided in Standard A-1, Modeling Input Data and Output Reports, Disclosure 4 complies with the standards adopted by the Commission on October 13 & 14, 2015, and concludes that the Florida Hurricane Model 2017a limited to the Florida hurricane model options selected (Standard A-1, Modeling Input Data and Output Reports, Disclosure 4) is sufficiently accurate and reliable for projecting hurricane loss costs and probable maximum loss levels for residential property in Florida.
